

The Microscopy Society of America stands with Ukraine and condemns the Russian invasion of a sovereign nation. The events of the past month conducted by Russia's leaders are shocking and horrific. MSA is committed to helping our Ukraine colleagues as much as possible. For the time being, we are making online content from the Microscopy Society of America freely available in Ukraine to support ongoing research endeavors. We will also waive publication fees for authors from Ukrainian institutions.

We also understand that appalling statements from Russian University leaders do not reflect the thoughts and values of their scientists, many of whom continue to call for an end to the conflict in Ukraine. Researchers from all background regardless of gender, race, or nationality should be supported not isolated. We wish to bridge scientific communities under duress and unify all members of the MSA family.

The MSA will continue to accept and provide access to manuscripts from Russian authors in accordance with our value system of inclusivity and consistent with current COPE guidelines: "Editorial decisions should not be affected by the origins of the manuscript, including the nationality, ethnicity, political beliefs, race, or religion of the authors. Decisions to edit and publish should not be determined by the policies of governments or other agencies outside of the journal itself."

As our excellent community of editors and reviewers continue to work, should members feel uncomfortable or bias in MSA-related scholarly activities, they can reach out to our editorial team and an alternative editor or reviewer can be assigned.

The MSA leadership and editorial team will continue to monitor the situation and provide additional updates and guidance as events unfold.
